

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POLICE SERVICES



Residents of the City of Laguna Hills can sleep easy knowing that they are living in one of the safest communities in the Country.

Studies show that South Orange County overall is the safest community in America. South Orange County cities are able to enjoy this security thanks to the hard work by the Orange County Sheriff's Department. Here's an overview of the statistics in service from 2010 and how Laguna Hills Police Services compares with other South County Cities.

Response Times

Calls for service are broken down into four categories, all of which Police Services answers within the expected amount of time for the priority of the call.

Priority one calls include criminal and non-criminal situations where there is immediate danger of injury to any person. Examples of these calls are violent assaults, robberies, burglaries in progress and injury traffic collisions. Police Services strives to make these calls

within five minutes or less. In 2010 priority one calls were answered in an average of 4:43 minutes.

Priority two calls consist of serious crimes that have just occurred, but present no immediate danger or the suspects have left. Examples include verbal disputes, robberies or burglaries which have occurred, bomb threats, alarm calls, deceased persons and suspected hazardous material spills. These calls are expected to be answered within 12 minutes of the time of dispatch. In 2010 response to these calls averaged 8:31 minutes.

Priority three calls include calls where crime suspects have left, reports of crimes significantly after they have occurred, non-injury traffic collisions, suspicious persons or public drunkenness. Police Services has 20 minutes to answer these calls. In 2010 the calls were answered with an average of 12:07 minutes.

Priority four calls are non-emergency incidents where the informant does not want or need to be contacted. Such calls are parking complaints, loud music or parties. These calls were answered in 2010 with an average of 19:22 minutes.



Laguna Hills Police Services was rated as “excellent” or “very good” by 97 percent of residents in the latest scientific community survey.

Community Involvement

Police Services is just a piece of the puzzle to keep Laguna Hills safe. Police Services cannot be everywhere at once in the City and relies on residents to help keep their communities safe and report incidents as needed. In 2010, the Neighborhood Watch program was expanded to include a total of 20 neighborhoods, enhancing safety in the City of Laguna Hills.

In addition to the Neighborhood Watch Program, Police Services and the Orange County Fire Authority offer residents a chance to participate in the Community Emergency Preparedness Academy. This course teaches residents basic first-aid and survival skills that will help in the event of an emergency or natural disaster should Fire and Police Services not be able to immediately reach residents.


Police Services by the Numbers

In 2010 Laguna Hills Police Services staff handled 12,725 incidents. Of these calls, 5,786 were calls from the public and 6,939 incidents were self-initiated while Deputies were on patrol. This number is slightly lower than in 2009 when Police Services handled 12,804 incidents.

Also in 2010, the City saw:

- An eight percent reduction in injury traffic collisions
- A 13 percent reduction in major crimes

Planning and Preparation for a Bright Financial Future

Ever since Laguna Hills incorporated as a City in 1991 it had a focus of being fiscally conservative which has paid off. In the early 1990's there was a severe housing crisis and recession that the City was able to successfully weather. Then in December of 2007 we were all hit with a recession that we continue to feel the effects of today. While the recession may have technically ended for many analysts in 2009, Laguna Hills has had to look ahead to continue to gauge the impact on the City from this continued economic hardship. By using budget projections, the City has retained strong financial health throughout the entirety of this recession and beyond.

Every two years, the City sets aside approximately six months to focus on budget preparation. One of the key goals during this process is to continue to manage costs while maintaining a high level of service for its residents. This ideal is key even in the face of many challenges such as:

- Prioritizing the City's operating and capital goals
- Adequately forecasting revenues
- Appropriately allocating each Department's budget

Strong planning at the City has allowed it to maintain healthy reserves while maintaining an operating surplus throughout the recession.

The City has completed the 2011-13 Biennial Budget in a strong financial standing. Looking both mid and long-term, the City's financial position is expected to improve and thrive over the next several years.

The budget appropriates the following expenditures for 2011-2013

Highlights of the 2011-2013 Biennial Budget

- Forecasted revenues and expenditures will enable the City to continue providing its basic City services as well as implement the 20 new Major Plans approved by the City Council.
- The budget projects an operating surplus over the next two years.
- General Fund revenues for the 2011-2012 fiscal year are anticipated to increase by 3% from the 2010-2011 fiscal year
- In the 2011-2012 fiscal year, operating expenditures are projected to decrease 1.4%, from the 2010-2011 amended budget.
- Personnel costs will decrease by nearly \$125,000 in the 2011-2012 fiscal year
- Twelve capital projects are scheduled for completion for a total estimated cost of \$3,654,000. Of this amount, only \$665,000 is required from the general fund and another \$675,000 is funded out of capital reserve funds. The remaining \$2,314,000 will come from various special revenue funds.

Eight-year Financial Plan

The City puts a large emphasis on long-term planning. One useful tool is the eight-year Financial Plan which evaluates long term implications of current financial decisions. Adhering to its eight-year financial plan keeps the City from using gimmicks or “quick fixes” to solve short-term financial challenges. The plan, while conservative, allows a glimpse into a strong financial future for the City.

Capital Improvement Projects

A capital improvement is any property enhancement—or “improvement”—that increases its overall value—or “capital.” Here in Laguna Hills, projects in this category are vital to continue to see the City grow and prosper. For the 2011-2013 Biennial Budget, the City has allocated \$3,654,000 towards 12 capital improvement projects. These projects will be funded over the course of the 2-year budget with special revenue funds in the amount of \$2,989,000, or 82% of the funding. The balance of \$665,000, or 18% of the funding, will be supported by the City's general fund.

The following list highlights the major capital expenditures among the 12 capital improvement projects scheduled during the 2011-2013 Biennial Budget:

- Annual Street Maintenance (\$1.84 million)
- Santa Maria Pavement Rehabilitation (\$200,000)
- Water Quality Program (\$400,000)
- Stockport Park Playground Renovations (\$200,000)
- Community Center Renovations (\$250,000)
- In addition to these projects, two significant capital improvement projects that have been carried over from the prior fiscal year are the I-5 at La Paz interchange and the Avenue de Carolita widening at El Toro Rd. together these projects total \$8,171,000.

LIVING WITH COYOTES

Coyote Reporting Procedures

If you see coyotes around your property or neighborhood contact Melissa Au-Yeung with the City of Laguna Hills at mau-yeung@ci.laguna-hills.ca.us and provide your name address and phone number along with information of where the coyote was seen.

If you have an encounter with a coyote, i.e. one enters your backyard and won't leave, attacks pets or if they appear to be acting strangely and in a threatening manner, contact OC Animal Care at **(949) 249-5160**. After contacting OC Animal Care please notify the City by e-mailing Melissa Au-Yeung.

If a person is attacked by a coyote call 911 immediately.



Coyotes in Laguna Hills

Laguna Hills enjoys a large amount of open space; however, rural open space areas are also the habitats for a number of wild animals, including coyotes. It is believed that many coyotes have become more daring as they are accustomed to living near residential areas. Coyotes often hunt between sunset and sunrise but can be seen at all hours of the day and night. Small pets can be viewed as an easy meal to a coyote. While they don't usually attack humans, coyotes can become aggressive if they are cornered. Parents should warn their children to avoid strange animals that are either domestic or non-domestic.

Here are some simple tips to prevent coyotes from visiting your home or neighborhood:

- Smaller pets should not be allowed outside alone, even in a fenced yard.
- Put garbage in tightly closed containers that cannot be tipped over, such as those provided by CR&R for curbside pick-up.

- Remove sources of water.
- Bring pets in at night, and do not leave pet food outside.
- Put away bird feeders at night to avoid attracting rodents and other coyote prey.
- Pet enclosures should be fully fenced in to keep the pet in and predators out.
- Pick up fallen fruit and cover compost piles.
- Trim ground-level shrubbery to reduce hiding places for coyotes.
- If followed by a coyote, make loud noises. If this fails, throw rocks in the animal's direction.

WASTE AND RECYCLING SERVICES FROM CR&R

Solid Waste Services

One of the goals for the City is to keep trash and recycling fees low for residents. However, due to certain circumstances, some fee hikes are unavoidable. In order to make up for factors including fee increases at the local landfills, CR&R's rates went up effective July 1, 2011. Residents saw a 1.1% increase (or a \$0.16/mo. increase) in their trash bill. The monthly rate prior to July 1st was \$14.79 and the new monthly rate is \$14.95.

Please remember you can request up to two additional green waste containers and up to two additional recycling (brown) carts free of charge by contacting CR&R at (877) 728-0446.

Plastic Bag Recycling

About 89 billion plastic bags, sacks and wraps are used every year in the United States. However, according to the EPA, only around 12 percent of these items are recycled. Laguna Hills wants to help do its part to enhance recycling in the City. Remember that plastic shopping and dry cleaning bags are recyclable and may be placed into your recycle cart provided by CR&R. To ensure these bags are recycled simply place shopping and dry cleaning bags bundled together inside a clear bag, then place your bundle inside your recycle cart with your other recyclables. CR&R will take care of the rest.

Some other interesting facts about plastic bags:

- Plastic bags are a primary source of litter because they are light and aerodynamic and are easily transported by wind into our waterways.
- Plastic bags are not biodegradable. Instead, the sun breaks them into small pieces that choke and kill sensitive marine species such as turtles and birds.
- A five-year-long study by the Ocean Conservancy found that small plastic bags made up about nine percent of the debris found along various U.S. coasts.

Mandatory Commercial Recycling

The City is closely monitoring the State of California's potential new regulations for a Mandatory Commercial Recycling Program. This program will require local agencies to develop a commercial recycling program by July 1, 2012. The purpose of the State's new regulation is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by diverting commercial solid waste to recycling efforts and to expand the opportunity for additional recycling services and recycling manufacturing facilities.

The City has taken proactive measures to ensure it meets all new regulations and standards by the deadline. Some of these initiatives include offering a source separation recycling bin to businesses and also processing commercial trash at CR&R's material recovery facility to recover as much recyclable material as possible.

Another way to decrease the amount of trash that ends up in landfills is through a diversion process. The City, with the assistance of CR&R, developed a commercial pilot food waste program during 2009 to divert food waste from the landfill. The food waste is processed into mulch at a processing facility. Currently, King's Fish House, Saddleback Memorial Medical Center, In-N-Out Burger, and the Farmer's Market at the Laguna Hills Mall are participating in this test diversion program. In one year 143 tons of food waste was collected, diverted from landfills and recycled.



COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT



Helping Others through Traumatic Events

Traumatic events such as natural disasters and family emergencies can be devastating for people. While these events can leave some feeling alone and with nowhere to go, there are groups that can help. Since 1995 the Trauma Intervention Program of Orange County (TIP) has helped people overcome grief and deal with tough times after a traumatic event.

This organization is comprised of volunteers that are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year who are called upon by police officers, firefighters, paramedics and hospital personnel to help assist family members and friends following a natural or unexpected death of a loved one or those who are victims of violent crimes, victims of fires, survivors of suicide or people that are distraught and seeking immediate support.

2012 Election, Do Your Part!

COMMUNITY INFORMATION



Citizen's Survey, How Does the City Measure Up?

Every two years the City authorizes a scientific and random survey of residents that takes an in depth look at a variety of categories to measure resident satisfaction with the City. The survey showed that residents are very pleased with the City. The 2011 Citizen Survey came back with high marks in all categories for the City and residents' quality of life. Overall, 96 percent of the respondents rated their community as an excellent or good place to live. Safety, which has been a priority for the City, also received high marks. Ninety-three percent of respondents felt either very safe or safe walking alone or with someone in their neighborhood at night. Respondents are also continuing to show increased favor that Laguna Hills is a good place to live. This year's survey showed that 67.5 percent of residents rated the City as an excellent place to live; as compared to the 1995 survey which showed 56.6 percent felt this way about Laguna Hills. Respondents also spoke favorably of the City's

outreach efforts, including City Views with 64.3 percent saying they were aware of the publication and of those aware of the publication, 87.6 percent read it with 89.6 percent of readers finding it useful.

Respondents were also satisfied with overall City operations and management. Eighty-three percent of the respondents said they were pleased with the overall direction of the City and 82.6 percent indicated that they agreed or strongly agreed with the statement "I receive good value for the City taxes I pay." The City will continue to explore and improve outlets for communication and information for everyone to access. While the survey showed solid results, the City plans to continue to strive to garner higher marks in each area as there is always room for improvement.






