

ON THE COVER

As 2011 comes to a close, the City of Laguna Hills continues its tradition of economic strength and fiscal prudence, as has been the case in the City's twenty years since incorporation. Although the Great Recession that began four years ago has led to a structural correction in the economy, what many are calling a "new normal," the City continues to flourish and fare better than most. The City experienced a 2.4% increase in General Fund revenues in FY 2010/2011 over the previous fiscal year. Largely due to fiscally conservative leadership and a concerted effort to minimize operating expenditures, Laguna Hills has garnered an operating surplus.

City of Laguna Hills Financial Report

This past year, the effects of the Great Recession have led to a structural correction in the economy as city governments have adjusted to a “new normal.” Due to the City’s continued unwavering commitment to conservative financial policies, Laguna Hills continues to fare better than most California cities and maintains a healthy operating surplus.

The City has seen its General Fund revenue increase by 2.4 percent, while at the same time reduced its operating expenditures by approximately \$900,000, or five percent of the budgeted amount for Fiscal Year 2010/2011. The Fiscal Year 2011/2012 Budget represents a reduction in operating expenses by \$243,793, or 1.4 percent from the previous fiscal year.

Like any of its residents or businesses, the City of Laguna Hills is committed to operating within its means and is proud of its ability to limit its expenditures and protect the Laguna Hills taxpayers. Naturally, when faced with a sustained period of economic uncertainty, prudent management dictates that

we proceed cautiously with respect to initiating any new programs or service commitments.



Award-Winning Financial Reporting

In recognition of Laguna Hills’ commitment to fiscal responsibility and reporting transparency, the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) has bestowed the City with its Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for the 19th year in a row to conclude the 2010 Fiscal Year.

Leasing Office Space at the Civic Center Generates Revenue

In spite of the difficulties prevalent in the commercial office market, City staff successfully negotiated the renewal of the Orange County Clerk-Recorder lease in the Civic Center. A new lease was also signed with the War Era Veterans. As of October 31, 2011, the Civic Center was 76 percent occupied. Most importantly, the Civic Center continued to serve as a revenue generating source for the City by posting a net income after expenses of \$105,245.

Senior Center Facility Grant

For the third year in a row, the City successfully competed for an award of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for Public Facilities and Improvement monies to be used at the Florence Sylvester Senior Center. Grant monies totaling \$62,453 were requested to complete energy efficiency upgrades that include the installation of a solar panel system. In the past, the grant has also provided resources to replace the carpet, to paint the interior and to install portable walls for storage areas.



City of Laguna Hills Programs and Services

Despite the challenges of reduced resources, Laguna Hills continues to provide a wide array of programs and services to the residents and businesses of Laguna Hills. In the City Manager's 2011 Year End Report, the City highlights the many programs, services and achievements it has accomplished over the past year.

Animal Services

The City conducted an intensive 13-week dog licensing canvassing campaign, which followed an 18-month public education effort and 45-day amnesty period. After the successful two year campaign, the City's compliance rate has increased to 58% - a ten point jump that places Laguna Hills second among all Orange County cities that contract with OC Animal Care.

Coyote Response

In response to an increased number of coyote sightings and aggressive behavior, staff conducted two successful trapping operations this past year. Additionally, a public education program was implemented including a featured link on the City website entitled "Living with Coyotes."

Web Streaming

This past spring, the City implemented new software that allowed for the audio/video web streaming of all City Council meetings.

3/5 Marine Battalion Support Committee

In November 2010, the City Council revived the Laguna Hills Support Committee for the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment out of Camp Pendleton, otherwise known as the 3/5 Battalion. The City has assisted with publicity of fundraising opportunities and modified the Memorial Day Half Marathon to allow runners to donate funds to the Committee.



Community Development

Building activity rebounded in 2011 with more than 1,100 building permits issued through September 30, 2011. That's a 39% increase over the nearly 800 building permits issued over the previous 12 months.

Capital Projects Completed

With construction costs down, the City has been able to maximize its resources to renovate two of its playgrounds. The first, at Costeau Park, has a new subsurface drainage system, new park benches, rubberized playground surface and playground equipment. The second, at the Community Center, has updated security lighting and a new rubberized playground surface.

La Paz Widening at I-5

The widening of La Paz provides additional on-ramp and off-ramp lanes to the freeway as well as modified traffic signals and landscape improvements. The \$7.6 million project was funded primarily through federal funding and Measure M dollars. There was no impact to the City's General Fund to implement this traffic relief project. Construction began in April 2011 and is scheduled for completion in June 2012.

Environment and Conservation

Since its inception in March 2010, an estimated 220 tons of food waste has been diverted from local landfills. Through an energy efficiency grant from the State, the Laguna Hills Civic Center has implemented energy efficiency improvements including new air conditioning units and new energy efficient light bulbs. To maintain good water quality, the City installed trash screens on 69 catch basins on city streets to prevent debris from entering the waterways.

Public Safety

Laguna Hills Police Services provides faster response times than the goals set by the department. Priority 1 calls have an expected response time of five minutes and averaged 4:50 in 2011. For the fourth year, Police Services allocated personnel to provide a full-time School Resource Officer for the schools in our City. The Neighborhood Watch program added four new groups and 100 new members and 35 residents took part in the eight week disaster preparedness training course provided by Police Services.

Laguna Hills continues to maximize its services and programs through thoughtful and careful financial planning. Laguna Hills resident Susan Caskey told Strong Cities, Strong State that the City's fiscally responsible practices "now pays off for all of us because we are able to continue to maintain the quality of life that makes Laguna Hills a great place to live and raise a family."

An Award-Winning Place to Live

In 2007, the South Orange County Regional Chambers of Commerce, the premier advocacy and business development organization in the region, presented the City of Laguna Hills with the "Commerce Award" for its focus on economic development and strong local economy. The South Orange County Regional Chambers of Commerce Chairman John Whitman said, "Part of our decision was based on the significant renovations of a beautiful building that now serves as the Laguna Hills Civic Center."



Safety First

Laguna Hills continues to be one of the safest communities in Orange County. Captain Steve Doan, former Chief of Police Services for the City of Laguna Hills said, "With a continued downward trend in crime, the City and the Orange County Sheriff's Department put a great emphasis in community outreach, crime prevention programs and emergency preparedness training."

MEMORIAL DAY HALF MARATHON

Lace Up Those Sneakers!

The 14th annual City of Laguna Hills Memorial Day Half Marathon, 5K and 10K, honoring the United States Marine Corps Dark Horse Battalion will be off and running on May 28, 2012. In addition to a 13.1 mile Half Marathon and the 5K run/walk (3.1 miles) and 10K run/walk (10.2 miles), there will also

be a half-mile Kid's Run and even a 50-yard "Diaper Dash" for the toddlers. All runs except the Kid's Run and Diaper Dash will begin in front of the Saddleback Memorial Medical Center and finish at the Laguna Hills Community Center. The Kid's Run and Diaper Dash start and finish at the Laguna Hills Community Center.

10K participants must start the race no later than 7:00 a.m. Half-marathoners must start the race no later than 7:10 a.m. and 5K participants must start the race no later than 7:15 a.m. Late arrivals will not be permitted to officially start the race.

Memorial Day Race to Honor Marine Corps Dark Horse Battalion



The City of Laguna Hills intends to donate \$3 per race participant to the United States Marine Corp 3/5 Dark Horse Battalion Support Committee. The 3/5 Dark Horse is the 3rd Battalion, 5th Marine Regiment and was adopted by Laguna Hills residents through a support committee known as "Team DARKHORSE." These volunteers provide "encouragement, relief and comfort to the 3/5 Marines, Sailors and their families."

The 3/5 Battalion was deployed in the Helmand Province in Afghanistan from October 2010 through April 2011 and lost 25 Marines in combat. Despite the loss of these fallen heroes, the 3/5 Battalion accomplished several strategic objectives, including regaining control of a key roadway, providing basic first aid supplies and health care education to more than 200 Afghans, building a new high school to replace the one destroyed by the Taliban, building two new water wells and providing security for more than 3,000 Afghani farmers who are growing wheat instead of poppy, which is the key ingredient in heroin.

MOVING FORWARD



Former Circuit City Site

Although Circuit City closed its doors in April 2009, the site remained an attractive retail location. Ashley Furniture purchased the property in January 2010 for \$11.4 million. Since then, City staff has worked with the new property owners to ensure both a desirable remodel of the building as well as a build-out of the site with additional retail/restaurant uses. The site is currently under development to add an additional 5,949 square feet of retail space that will serve as the new home to an Ashley Furniture, Total Wine and More and Chick-Fil-A. Construction on the site is anticipated to be completed in Spring of 2012.

In order to accommodate the redevelopment of the former Circuit City site and in anticipation of the future mixed-use development plans for Oakbrook Village and the Laguna Hills Mall, construction is underway to widen Avenida de la Carlota to allow for better traffic flow.





Moulton La Paz Neighborhood Shopping Center

The owner of the Moulton La Paz neighborhood shopping center recently submitted a development application which proposes to renovate the existing shopping center. During the last General Plan Update, the City rezoned about 2.2 acres of the 11 acre open space located on the north side of La Paz Road and west of Moulton Parkway to commercial. The City is in negotiations with the owner of the shopping center for the commercial site. The City's overall goals are to facilitate the redevelopment of a run-down shopping center and raise funds to environmentally remediate and rehabilitate the denuded nine acres of remaining open space. The remaining open space on La Paz Road will remain passive open space with attractive landscaping and trails.

OAKBROOK VILLAGE CENTER IN PLANNING STAGES

The owner of Oakbrook Village (Fritz Duda Company) has submitted a development plan that will create a mixed-use development concept with new retail and residential units on the 20-acre, 200,000 square-foot site.

This past year, the City partnered with the owners to market the development at the International Council of Shopping Centers (ICSC) Western Division Deal Making Convention and anticipates doing so again this year. Retail interest in this site remains strong with its outstanding visibility from the I-5 freeway.

"Our Cultural History" Speaker's Series

Travel through time and relive the Saddleback Valley's early history through stories and art. The Civic Center's Public Art Program was designed to celebrate the rich history of the area and the following lecture series has been developed to enhance each element of the public art display through educational discussions, tours, and activities.

The series is organized as a set of time or history related lectures that progress from early time and later cover the history of Laguna Hills in chronological order. The first class begins with the geological development of the land that is now southern Orange County, the ancient seas and fossil beds, the land forms and environment now present that the first humans to settle the region found. The series continues in the second session describing the Rancho Days of the Saddleback Valley - the large land grants of Serrano, Avila, and Yorba and how these estates developed out of mission lands and the spread of cattle over the hills. The third and final class brings participants to the edge of our own time, with the passing of the Mexican ranchos and development of farms that were here just before cities were established.

Each session will be approximately three hours in duration - a two hour lecture and discussion, followed by a related activity, usually guided walks on a nearby landscape related to the day's subject, tour or activity. Attendees will be responsible for their own transportation to offsite activity sites - maps will be provided at discussion. 
