DIAL A TAXI

Seniors already registered with the City's Dial-A-Taxi program should call toll free (877) 809-6587 to arrange pick up.

Laguna Hills seniors can participate in the Dial-A-Taxi Senior Transportation Program, which provides door-to-door taxi service to Laguna Hills residents 60 years and older, by registering and paying a co-pay of as little as \$5. To register for the Dial-A-Taxi program, fill out an application form and return it in person to the Laguna Hills Community Center at 25555 Alicia Parkway, Laguna Hills, CA 92653. ABOUT NATIONAL NIGHT OUT

National Night Out, "America's Night Out Against Crime," was launched in 1984 by the non-profit National Association of Town Watch (NATW). The goal of the program is to promote crime prevention activities, police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie. The first National Night Out took place on Tuesday, August 7, 1984. That first year, 2.5 million Americans took part across 400 communities in 23 states. National Night Out now involves over 37 million people and 15,000 communities from all the 50 states, U.S. Territories, Canadian cities, and military bases worldwide.



All residents are invited to partake in the National Night Out crime and drug prevention event on **Tuesday, August 5**. Laguna Hills Police Services will host an interactive community safety fair from **5 p.m. to 8 p.m.** at the Laguna Hills Community Center, located at 25555 Alicia Parkway. Water Conservation Requirements for New Construction

If you are thinking about renovating or adding on to your home, there is a State law that may affect you. Passed in 2009, Senate Bill 407 (SB 407) may require you to install water-conserving devices throughout your residence. As of January 1, 2014, SB 407 requires **single-family homeowners** to upgrade inefficient plumbing fixtures with water-saving plumbing fixtures when certain alterations or improvements are made. Single-family homes built on or after January 1, 1994, should already be in compliance with the requirements of SB 407. It is important to note that the sale of the home does not trigger the requirements of SB 407.

Examples of inefficient plumbing fixtures include the following:

- Any toilet manufactured to use more than 1.6 gallons of water per flush;
- Any showerhead manufactured to have a flow capacity of more than 2.5 gallons of water per minute;
- Any interior faucet that emits more than 2.2 gallons of water per minute.



Based on the definitions provided in State building codes, alterations and improvements are interpreted to mean any construction to an existing structure which enhance or improve the structure. Permits pulled for construction related to repairs or maintenance of structures are not considered to be alterations or improvements that trigger the new requirements. The law also does not apply to the resale of properties.

Repairs that will not trigger SB 407 include the following:

- Electrical service upgrades
- Heating and cooling upgrades
- Water heater replacements
- New roofs
- Sewer line replacement
- New siding or stucco
- Photovoltaic installations (solar panels)
- Electric vehicle charging equipment
- Window replacements
- Site work such as retaining walls, fences, and walkways
- Swimming pools
- Detached accessory structures such as garages or storage sheds
- Minor repairs



To meet the obligations of SB 407, the City is required to verify that water conserving plumbing fixtures are installed before a permit for new construction can be given a final sign-off.

Exceptions to the requirements can also be made under the following circumstances:

- A licensed plumber certifies that due to the age or configuration of the property or its plumbing, the installation of water-conserving plumbing fixtures is not technically feasible.
- A building's water service has been permanently disconnected.
- A visual inspection and verification by the City Building Inspector that all fixtures are in compliance as outlined in the law.
- Written certification from the licensed contractor who obtained the building permit that fixtures are in compliance as outlined in the law.

Additionally, SB 407 requires that all inefficient plumbing fixtures in a single-family residence be upgraded to water-saving plumbing fixtures by January 1, 2017. Multi-family commercial properties must also meet the requirements of SB 407 by January 1, 2019.




