DIAL-A-TAXI

Seniors already registered with the City's Dial-A-Taxi program should call toll free (877) 809-6587 to arrange pick up.

Laguna Hills seniors can participate in the Dial-A-Taxi Senior Transportation Program, which provides door-to-door taxi service to Laguna Hills residents 60 years and older, by registering and paying a co-pay of as little as \$5. To register for the Dial-A-Taxi program, fill out an application form and return it in person to the Laguna Hills Community Center at 25555 Alicia Parkway, Laguna Hills, CA 92653. The Community Center is open from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and on Sunday from noon to 6 p.m. You



can get a copy of the registration form online at www.lagunahillsca.gov under "Departments" then "Community Services."

To register, you will need to show proof of Laguna Hills residency and proof of age.

HOLIDAY SAFETY



Fall has arrived and the holidays are quickly approaching. Throughout all the credit card usage, gift buying, internet shopping and vacations, many people become susceptible to being victims of crime. Taking preventative measures will help lead you through the holiday season without jeopardizing your property and financial security. Please use the following information to help you get through a crime free holiday season.

As we prepare for gifts, family gatherings and festivities, shopping will increase over the next couple months. While you are out shopping, always be alert and aware of your surroundings and others around you. Always carry your purse or wallet and do not leave these items in the cart. Many people try to do all their shopping in one day and spend many hours at the same location. If you do a lot of shopping in one place, avoid taking your bags to your vehicle until you are ready to leave. If you are observed dropping items off and going back in the store, your vehicle may become a target for crime. Do not give a burglar any opportunity to break into your vehicle. **Please remember to always lock your vehicle and do not leave any items in plain sight!**

Many Christmas trees are beautifully decorated and showcased in the front window of a home. It is widely known that where there is a Christmas tree, there are presents underneath it. It's best to not display your presents under the tree until you are ready to celebrate the holiday, especially if they can be seen from doors or windows. Once you have celebrated the holidays, be sure to break down the boxes of



your larger gifts so they fit into your recyclable trash containers. Leaving empty boxes of iPads, laptops, televisions or other valuable items out for display next to the trash container alerts burglars to what is inside your home.

Some shoppers like to avoid the crowded malls and stores by shopping online and having their packages delivered to them. Be sure to remove delivered mail and packages from your home mailbox and front porches as soon as possible. The best option is to have packages delivered to a location where someone will be available to accept them, instead of being left unattended on your front porch. If you are home waiting for your deliveries, do not ignore the solicitors ringing the doorbell or knocking on your door. Acknowledge you are home by talking through the door and report suspicious and aggressive solicitors to us.

Traveling for the holidays? Double check that your windows and doors are closed and locked **EVERYTIME** you leave your home. If you will be gone for numerous days, make your house look "lived in" by asking your neighbors to pick up your mail and newspapers or stop the service, and place timers on different lamps and televisions or radios throughout the house. In addition, be careful what travel information you or your children post on social media. Thieves can locate that information from social media profiles that are not private.

While Laguna Hills is one of the safest cities in Orange County, crime can happen anywhere at any time. We highly encourage you to report suspicious activity to Sheriff's Dispatch at (949) 770-6011 while you are observing them. For emergencies and crimes in progress, call 911.


TEAM DARK HORSE UPDATE


