



MERLONE-GEIER PARTNERS TAKES STRATEGIC PAUSE AT FIVE LAGUNAS


Merlone-Geier Partners (MGP), the owner of the former Laguna Hills Mall, has announced that it is taking a strategic pause in the redevelopment of the former Laguna Hills Mall, now known as Five Lagunas. This action by MGP was prompted by their recent buy out of the Macy's leasehold interest. The City approved a site plan in March of 2016 that included over 880,000 square feet

With the recent acquisition of the Macy's lease, and the announcement by Macy's that it will be closing its Laguna Hills location in early 2018, MGP is now "shifting around portions of the site plan" to "take advantage of a new opportunity" and "address recent trends that we are seeing take place in the market," according to Vice President of Development Stephen Logan. Mr. Logan also stated that MGP "will release a new construction completion date in the near future" and that "MGP is fully committed



of commercial space including a 14-screen luxury theater, health club, restaurants, and retail shops. The approval also included 988 luxury residential apartment units. Since the 2016 approval, MGP has completed parking lot renovations in front of Nordstrom Rack, relocated Ruby's into a new 6,000 square foot shop space, and completed another 6,000 square foot space for Subway. Significant portions of the in-ground utility infrastructure were also completed.

to the redevelopment of Five Lagunas and we are excited at the prospect of announcing our plans shortly." City staff expects to receive a new project plan early next year. In the meantime, the existing stores and restaurants continue to be open for business. Information about future changes will be posted on the City's website under "Current Planning Projects" when they become available.

➤ **ON-LINE PLAN CHECK PROCESSING NOW AVAILABLE FOR BUILDING PERMIT REQUESTS**

The City of Laguna Hills Building Division has joined a growing number of cities that offer an alternative to using paper plans at city hall to obtain a building permit. Technology upgrades made earlier this year in the City's Building Division allow the City's plan check team to now accept digital plans on-line using Portable Document Format (PDF) files. This latest effort adds to the City's growing list of building services that can be obtained over the internet.

In describing the service enhancement, City Manager Bruce Channing said, *"We are extremely pleased to be able to make this service available to our residents, business owners, contractors, and design professionals. We are now able to provide 24/7 access to our building permit process and reduce our customers' costs of doing business with the City. Our*

clients no longer need to sit in traffic, take time off from work, or wait in line to submit a plan."

Despite the shift toward the acceptance of digital plans, the City will continue to process paper plans at the building permit counter, as well as digital plans. Account registration is required for on-line submissions, along with the ability to pay using a debit or credit card. City staff will also convert paper plans, up to 11" x 17", to PDF format at no additional cost. Once a plan is approved, the applicant is responsible for printing out the approved set for the City building inspector's use on the job site in accordance with state building codes.

LAW ENFORCEMENT COST & EFFICIENCY STUDY

Since its incorporation, the City has contracted with the Orange County Sheriff's Department (OCSD) for law enforcement and traffic enforcement services. Throughout the duration of this partnership, the City has been satisfied with the overall quality of service provided by OCSD. Although there have been no performance issues to-date, the cost of the law enforcement services contract has continued to significantly strain the City's financial resources. In Fiscal Year 2017/2018, the cost of the OCSD contract is just under \$8 million, which represents approximately 42% of the City's General Fund

expenditures. Furthermore, the cost of the OCSD contract has continually outpaced inflation and is now 14% higher than it was a decade ago.

With that in mind, and due to mounting fiscal pressures, the City has partnered with the twelve other cities in Orange County that contract with OCSD to evaluate the current agreement model and explore efficiencies that will ensure long-term cost sustainability. To that end, the combined thirteen cities (Aliso Viejo, Dana Point, Laguna Hills, Laguna Niguel, Laguna Woods, Lake Forest, Mission Viejo, Rancho Santa Margarita, San Clemente, San Juan Capistrano, Stanton, Villa Park, and Yorba Linda)

entered into a Memorandum of Understanding to collectively hire an independent third party, which will review and analyze the existing contract service model, cost assumptions, methodologies, and allocations of costs and provide recommendations for ensuring the long-term financial stabilization of the contract.

The City of Mission Viejo has assumed the lead role in the project and will release a Request for Proposals to hire a qualified consultant to perform the cost and efficiency study. The project is expected to be completed in the latter part of 2018.

NEW HOURS OF OPERATION FOR THE LAGUNA HILLS TECHNOLOGY LIBRARY BRANCH

Beginning on January 1, 2018, the Laguna Hills Technology Library Branch (Library) will have new hours of operation as follows:

The alteration to the Library schedule follows a decision from the County of Orange, which owns and operates the Library, to reduce the days of service per week.

Services at the Library will remain the same. A few of the services offered at the Laguna Hills location include high speed internet access and eighteen desktop computer stations for public use. Each computer is equipped with Microsoft Office software, including Word, Excel, PowerPoint, Access, and Publisher. 
